  - School Family Handbook - this manual needs to be read in preparation for the interview. It can be viewed on NVCA's website.
  - Letter of Reference for middle and upper school students, when possible, from the pastor of the church the student attends.

- Family Interview - will follow the entrance testing and receipt of the student's report cards and personal evaluation forms. We will contact you to set up an appointment.
- Step 4:** Upon notification of ACCEPTANCE:

# NORTHERN VIRGINIA CHRISTIAN ACADEMY STATEMENT OF FAITH

We believe that the God of the Bible is the source of all truth; thus, all genuine intellectual pursuits lead logically to God. The Bible is the infallible Word of God, and as such it, and not man, is the standard of truth. Furthermore, we consider the primary goal of all of life and education to be the glory of God and the revelation of Jesus Christ, the hope of glory.

We are in agreement with the following historic, evangelic, Christian tenets: Salvation comes by grace alone, through faith alone, because of Christ alone, for the glory of God alone. Salvation, the free gift of God, is provided not because of any works of man but because of Christ's finished work of atonement on the cross. We seek to promote unity and charity among those affirming these truths.

When we talk about the essentials of Christianity, we refer to the basic doctrines characterizing our faith and personal relationship with Christ, separating Biblical Christianity from other beliefs. We express these doctrines as follows:

We affirm the existence of a triune God, or one God in three distinct Persons—the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. This God is self-existent, eternal, unchanging, omnipotent, omniscient, omnipresent, holy, righteous, and loving. God created the universe from nothing, and He is sovereign over His creation.

We believe in the authority of Scripture, affirming the Bible as God's inspired, infallible, and inerrant Word. It is the ultimate source of truth and knowledge about God, as well as the definitive guide for our daily lives.

We believe man is a spiritual and physical being created in God's image. Because of sin, however, man lost his fellowship with God, and apart from salvation in Christ, will suffer God's judgment and eternal condemnation in Hell.

By God's grace, Jesus Christ—fully God and fully man—was sent to save us from our bondage to sin. We believe Christ was born of a virgin, died for our sins, physically rose from the dead, and will one day return to judge the living and the dead, and deliver His people. Presently Christ is in Heaven, exalted at the right hand of God. At death the believer's soul passes immediately into the presence of God, and the unbeliever's soul is eternally separated from God unto condemnation.

We believe a personal relationship with Jesus Christ and not man's religion leads to salvation. Our justification includes the forgiveness of sin and the gift of eternal life because of the exchanged life and Christ's imputed righteousness. Through the indwelling Holy Spirit, we are sanctified by God's grace and called to pursue a life of holiness in Christ.

# Northern Virginia Christian Academy Dress Code

**The purpose of the dress code is two-fold:** 1) to promote the qualities of cleanliness, neatness, and modesty; and 2) to promote a learning environment with a minimum of distractions.

It is the student's responsibility to wear the appropriate attire and maintain a personal appearance within these guidelines. Parents are expected to help students comply with the dress code. The Administration will be the final authority in the interpretation of the code. Any clothing considered by the Administration to be outside the boundaries of the school dress code will not be permitted.

The guidelines that follow are the minimum standard for dress at NVCA.

## **GENERAL GUIDELINES:**

### **Shirts:**

- Collared dress, polo and/or golf shirt style with sleeves (short or long) and must be relaxed fit (not tight)
- Regular and mock turtlenecks shirts are also acceptable as collared shirts.
- Non-collared shirts, not undershirts, with no objectionable writing or advertisements/slogans are allowed as long as they are worn with a collared shirt over them.
- As minimum, shirts with buttons are to be buttoned up to but not including the top button
- Shirts that are designed to be a tuck-in shirt must be tucked in. Shirts tailored to be worn outside do not need to be tucked in.

### **Pants:**

- Pants and slacks are acceptable plus capris pants for girls. They are to be a "Relaxed Fit." Color choices are khaki, off white, black, navy, brown and gray.
- Pants made of Jean material, of any color, are not permitted.
- Pants cannot be frayed, tattered or have holes in them.
- Pants must be worn above the hips.
- Pants that have belt loops require a belt
- Pants can be no longer than the instep.

### **Skirts:**

- Girls may wear skirts.
- Skirt length can be no more than two inches above the knee when kneeling.
- Skirts made of jean material are not permitted.
- Skirts cannot be frayed, tattered or have holes in them.
- Skirts must be worn above the hips.
- Skirts with belt loops require a belt.

### **Shorts:**

- Shorts, plus skorts for girls, may be worn during the months of September, May and June.
- Color options are khaki, off white, black, navy, brown and gray.
- Length can be no more than two inches above the knee when kneeling
- Jean material is not acceptable
- Shorts and skorts cannot be frayed, tattered or have holes in them.
- Shorts and skorts must be worn above the hips.
- Shorts and skorts with belt loops must have a belt

**Sweaters and Jackets:**

- All materials, fabrics, except for jean material, are permitted.
- Jackets will not be worn in school.
- Sweatshirts are not permitted.
- Hooded outer ware will not be worn in school.

**Hygiene/Makeup and Jewelry:**

- Hair neatly trimmed, well groomed.
  - Boys hair, when it is naturally groomed, must be above and off the collar and bangs must be above the eyebrows.
  - Color must be natural; no pink, blue, green, unnatural red, etc.
  - No faddish haircuts
- Jewelry/Accessories
  - Girls - maximum of two earrings in each ear, no gauges
  - Boys - no earrings
  - Wallet and chains must be kept in the pockets.
  - Sunglasses, hats, caps, hoods and the like will NOT be worn inside the school building.
  - Belts – no studded belts.
  - Girls – make-up, is to be natural looking, no extremes
  - No visible tattoos and body piercing

**Foot Wear:**

- Leather dress shoes, walking shoes and sneakers are acceptable footwear.
- Sneakers are to be low-cut, **no higher than the ankle** with laces tied.
- Military style boots/shoes, work boots/shoes, hiking boots/shoes, and the like, are not permitted.
- Dress sandals are permitted. All other sandal styles and crocks are not permitted.
- Socks are required at all times for approved shoes and sneakers.

**Spirit Day** (Dress-down Day) – Spirit Day will be earned by students for compliance with the dress code. Frequency is not guaranteed. Jeans may be worn provided the student is wearing Spirit Wear (i.e. Falcon T-shirt). Spirit Wear must be visible and worn all day.

### ATHLETIC PARTICIPATION and ELIGIBILITY

In order for a student to participate in any sport they must secure and fill out the appropriate permission forms from the office prior to the first practice. The \$125 per sport Athletic Participation Fee must be paid before the first game to be eligible to play.

Permission to participate in the sport must also be approved by the student's physician. Students should use the VHSL Physical Form on the NVCA website, [www.nvchristianacademy.org](http://www.nvchristianacademy.org), also available in the school office.

Parents must agree not to hold the school liable for injuries received in volunteer sports activities. Also, they must be willing to grant permission to the school to provide appropriate medical care to the athlete in case of emergency, including calling 911.

Parents are responsible for having athlete picked up promptly after practices and/or games at the designated location. Failure to comply may jeopardize player's eligibility.

#### GUIDELINES FOR SPORTS ELIGIBILITY

1. Eligibility will be based on a student having a 2.0 GPA or better and no "F's" on their report card at any time.
2. If a student receives an "F" on their **mid-term grade report**, that student, at the coach's discretion, may practice with the team but that student cannot play in games, dress with the team, sit with the team on the bench or travel with the team until the "F" grade is remediated.
3. If a student receives an "F" on a **report card** that student is suspended from their team. They may not practice, play, or travel with their team until the next **mid-term grade report** or until the "F" is remediated to a "C" or better. That student will be placed on academic probation and must obtain weekly grade averages, in the course carrying the "F," until the next report card is issued.
4. A student athlete is reviewed for eligibility each time grades are reported.
5. It is a privilege to belong to a Northern Virginia Christian Academy sports team. All athletes are expected to adhere to the code of conduct as prescribed by the Academy Handbook. An administrator may withhold eligibility for any athlete prior to try-outs solely on the basis of repeated poor conduct. Any player who is temporarily suspended from a team for reasons of disciplinary problems in the classroom or violation of team rules may not practice, play or travel with the team for the period of suspension.
6. Athletes are expected to attend all classes on game day if they expect to play. Any exceptions can only be approved by the Headmaster.
7. Students are to take their books and belongings with them to practice. They will not be allowed to go back to their lockers or be in the hallways after 3:30 p.m.
